

# Loom Weaving Instructions

## Pot Holder Instructions:

### Step 1: Stretching Loopers

**IMPORTANT:** Stretch each looper to remove elasticity before you use it.  
Start a looper on the first peg and stretch it to the peg directly horizontally across.

### Step 2: Repeat this process 17 more times

Create your own design by varying the colors you use.

### Step 3: Cross Weaving

Starting at the end of the loom, weave your hook straight edge first over and under loopers in place shown. Take a "stretched" looper, catch one end of it with your hook and hold the other end with your hand.

Pull looper through, holding one end in the first peg. Then stretch the other end over the opposite first peg.

### Step 4:

When you weave the next looper, start your hook under and over loopers (opposite previous one.)

### Step 5:

Continue the process, straightening each row as you go.

### Step 6: Finishing the Edges

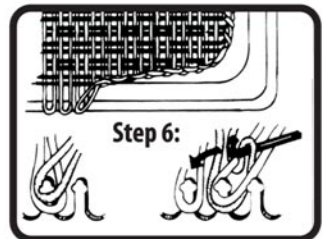
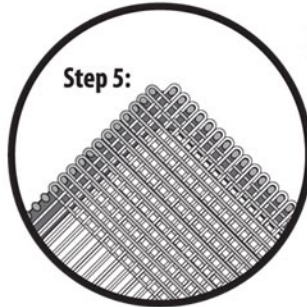
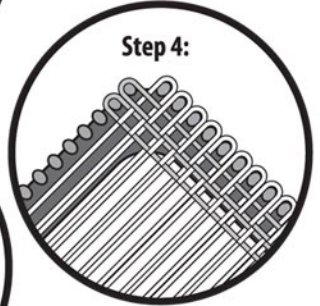
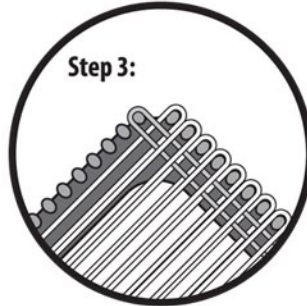
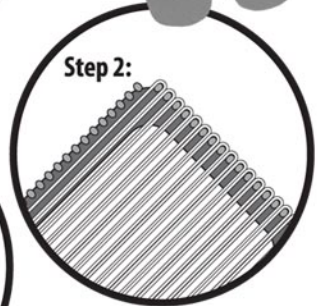
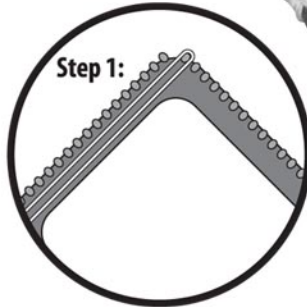
To make a lace edged potholder, insert the looper hook through the first loop in any one of the four corners. Remove this loop and slip it over the second peg. Now, pick up the bottom loop from the second peg and pull it through the top loop and place it on the next peg.

The top loop is now laced, and will easily slip off the peg. Continue this lacing procedure around all four sides of the loom until all loops have been removed.

**Helpful hint:** re-hook corners back on loom so things stay organized until after you finish the edging.

Pull the last loop through so that it can be used as a hanger for your potholder.

**Note:** Potholders are not recommended for oven use. Potholders are safe to use with cookware where temperatures do not exceed 300° F.  
**POT HOLDERS SHOULD BE USED ONLY WITH ADULT SUPERVISION.**

# Loom Loop Critters

## Panda

1. Create 1 woven loom loop square, using all white loops and 1 woven square using all orange loops.
2. Use embroidery floss to stitch the white square to the orange square. Before you finish stitching the edges, fill with stuffing. Continue stitching the square closed and tie a knot to secure the stitches.
3. Use your own glue to attach felt pieces and googly eyes as shown.



## Bird

1. Create a woven loom loop square, using all blue loops.
2. Fold the square diagonally to make a triangle. Use embroidery floss to stitch the edges together. Before you finish stitching the edges, fill with stuffing. Continue stitching the triangle closed and tie a knot to secure the stitches.
3. Use your own glue to attach felt pieces and googly eye as shown.
4. Tie a couple of loom loops to one end to create a tail for your bird!

## Dinosaur

1. Create a woven loom loop square, using yellow loops.
2. Fold the square diagonally to make a triangle. Use embroidery floss to stitch the edges together. Before you finish stitching the edges, fill with stuffing. Continue stitching the triangle closed and tie a knot to secure the stitches.
3. Use your own glue to attach felt pieces and googly eye as shown.
